Recently, the City of Fort Worth received a DEAAG award of \$1,900,000.00 for renovations to the Family Military Resource Center at NAS JRB FW. The center provides morale, welfare, and recreation facilities, a variety of housing units, limited stores and services, and a family support center network with full advocacy resources. NAS JRB FW also has a variety of school partnership programs, community volunteer programs, and education and business training for military families.

ECONOMIC IMPACT

The Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts estimates the population directly affiliated with NAS JRB FW contributed at least \$4.8 billion to the Texas economy in 2023. The Comptroller's economic impact analysis represents a conservative estimate of the economic importance of NAS JRB FW to Texas. Each installation's distinctive characteristics contribute to the Texas economy in different ways. This analysis uses a consistent model to determine the economic impact of each of the state's military installations to the state's economic growth.
